Purpose

To provide financial assistance to a Plymouth-Canton Community School graduate who is furthering his/her education.

Scholarship Amount

A \$1000.00 (non-renewable) scholarship will be awarded to one student selected. The award payment will be made after the Scholarship Committee receives proof of acceptance to a Michigan Institution of learning.

Eligibility

1. Senior in a Plymouth-Canton Community School
2. Attended Allen Elementary School for at least four years
3. Intends to continue his/her education in an accredited college, university, vocational or trade school in the state of Michigan
4. Proof of acceptance to a Michigan institution of learning
5. Involvement in school and/or community activities

Requirements

1. Submit a one-page essay: "How do the virtues of the Optimist's Creed exemplify the human qualities you learned as an Allen Elementary School student? Use specific examples from your days at Allen Elementary School in your essay. (Optimist Creed is attached)
2. Include a cover letter giving information about yourself and your plan for the future. Please include your contact information including name, address, phone number and email.
3. One written recommendation from a teacher or administrator that you have worked with in your current school.
4. One written recommendation from an unrelated adult not affiliated with the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.
5. Meet with the Plymouth-Canton Optimist Club. Read and discuss your essay with the club. The \$1,000 scholarship check will be presented to you at this club meeting.
